

Beaufort-Jasper County REALTORS® September Market Reports

Beaufort, SC (October 13, 2025) – U.S. existing-home sales were virtually unchanged from the previous month, dipping just 0.2% to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 4.0 million units, according to the National Association of REALTORS® (NAR). Most of these transactions went under contract in June and July, when mortgage rates were 40 to 50 basis points higher than current levels. Year-over-year, sales increased 1.8%, with the strongest activity occurring in the Midwest, where the typical home price is 22% below the national median.

New Listings were up 23.8 percent to 302. Pending Sales increased 38.5 percent to 259. Inventory grew 48.8 percent to 1,193 units.

Prices moved higher as Median Sales Price was up 0.2 percent to \$418,531. Days on Market increased 2.5 percent to 121 days. Months Supply of Inventory was up 28.9 percent to 4.9 months, indicating that supply increased relative to demand. Nationally, housing inventory declined for the first time this year, slipping 1.3% month-over-month to 1.53 million units, representing a 4.6-month supply at the current sales pace, according to NAR. Despite the monthly drop, total inventory remained 11.7% higher than the same time last year. Meanwhile, the median existing-home price rose 2% year-over-year to \$422,600, though it was essentially flat compared to the prior month.

Our AFJROTC cadets proudly represented Beaufort High School at the NASCAR Truck Series "Sober or Slammer 200" on Saturday, August 30, 2025, performing the color guard during the national anthem. The color guard was expertly commanded by Cadet Travis Patterson, who also carried the United States Flag with distinction. Cadets Mallorg Gomes and Adam Thompson served as Left Guard and Right Guard respectively. Their flawless execution reflected countless hours of practice and dedication.

This prestigious opportunity marks the second nationally televised appearance for our AFJROTC color guard. Last November, our cadets performed at the Jacksonville Jaguars versus Green Bay Packers NFL game, demonstrating their growing reputation for excellence. Looking ahead, they have already secured another national appearance this December when they will present the colors at the Jaguars versus Jets game.

Color guard participation serves multiple purposes for our cadets. Beyond providing valuable community service, these experiences foster essential teamwork skills and instill discipline. Our program follows a progressive training approach, allowing new cadets to develop their skills at Junior Varsity football games before advancing to Varsity games with larger audiences and the accompanying butterflies that come with performing before bigger crowds.

Beyond sporting events, our AFJROTC color guard remains active throughout the community. You can find our cadets marching proudly in Veterans Day and Memorial Day parades, as well as presenting colors for various local organizations and civic events.

The continued success of our color guard program reflects the commitment of our cadets and instructors to excellence and service. We congratulate Cadets Patterson, Frazer, Parker, and Thompson on their outstanding representation of our school and program on the national stage.
